- MTP Update:
  - **Engagement Takeaways**
  - Community input was gathered through three methods: discussions with key stakeholders, a public open house, and a transportation preference survey. A broader community survey was also conducted by the Rome Floyd Chamber in early 2025. From these sources of input, the following themes emerged:
  - **System Reliability and Congestion:** Especially with the significant amount of construction and maintenance that has happened on central corridors since the last long-range plan

many felt that the system was performing poorly and that individual drivers' responses to finding alternative routes has produced unsafe conditions.

- **Broader Alternatives:** While reliability, congestion, and safety consistently rank as top priorities, subjects such as public transit, bike and pedestrian infrastructure, and accessibility were a primary focus for many individuals. High priority in these areas was often associated with specific needs or groups, for example elderly populations reliant on wheelchairs or public transit or low-income households unable to afford a personal vehicle.
- **Managing Growth:** Although current growth has slowed and the Governor's office does not expect significant long-term population growth in the county, the impacts of growth over the last decade and the upcoming growth associated with the SK-Hyundai plant had many concerned with further degradation of the transportation system in both performance and the condition of the physical assets.
  
- It should be noted that larger population groups were more likely to have responded to the survey than their relative proportion of the population. Respondent demographic trends included:
  - **Sex and Age.** Respondents skewed roughly twenty percent more female than the population, and respondents were more likely to be 30 to 64 years old than 20 to 29 or over 65.
  - **Race and Ethnicity.** Non-white, non-Hispanic populations were overrepresented among respondents despite being a growing share of the region's demographic makeup.
  - **Income Bracket.** Middle incomes (\$50,000-150,000) were more likely than high incomes (\$150,000+) and much more likely than low incomes (less than \$50,000) to have responded.

- **0004915 SR 140 FM SR 53/FLOYD TO 0.3 MI W OF OOTHKALOOGA CRK/BARTOW** Widening and Reconstruction Project
  - Contractor (G.P.'S ENTERPRISES, INC.) shifted traffic to newly constructed Westbound lanes at Wall 2 (across from Old Hwy 140). Removing and reconstructing existing Lanes in this area. Current Completion Date: 5/31/2025. 97% Complete.
- **0013937 SR 1/US 27 @ BIG DRY CREEK/OOSTANAULA RIVER IN ROME** (At Berry College)
  - Contract awarded to C.W. Matthews. Traffic shifted to SB lanes in June 2024. NB lanes of existing bridge have been removed. Anticipated Completion: 3/31/2026. 58% Complete.
- **0015544 FLOYD, SR 293 @ DYKES CREEK** Bridge Replacement
  - Subcontractor constructing temporary detour bridge for traffic shift prior to existing bridge demolition.
  - Anticipated Completion Date: 12/31/2025. 49% Complete.
- **0019285 FLOYD, SR 1 FM CEDAR AVE TO E 2ND AVE & SR 20 FM SR 1 TO CHATEAU DR** Guardrail Improvements
  - Contractor removing and replacing guardrail per construction plans. Anticipated Completion Date was: 10/31/24. 83% Complete.
- **0016611 - CR 924/BELLS FERRY ROAD @ WOODWARD CREEK**
  - This project is the replacement of the bridge on CR 924/Bells Ferry Road at Woodward Creek. Anticipated Let Date: 12/19/2025
- **650540- FLOYD, SR 101/2nd Ave** Widening and Reconstruction
  - Anticipated completion date: 10/15/26. Storm drain and water line complete. 27% complete.
- **0013690 - PEDESTRIAN UPGRADES @ 19 LOCS IN FLOYD COUNTY**
  - The project proposes pedestrian upgrades at 14 locations in Floyd County. The project will improve pedestrian mobility at each intersection by adding and/or upgrading pedestrian related infrastructure and equipment and bringing the intersections up to ADA standards. Pedestrian

related upgrades include crosswalks, pedestrian signs, pedestrian signal heads and pushbuttons, pedestrian related cabinet equipment, ADA compliant ramps, and refuge islands. This project will also install the FYA signal heads, backplates and strain poles. Anticipated Let Date: 8/15/2026

- **0018282 - SR 101 @ CS 1053/12TH STREET**
  - The proposed improvement would reconstruct the intersection as a single roundabout. The roundabout will be single lane for all approaches except for the SB approach which will provide separate lanes for the through and left turn movements. Anticipated Let Date: 10/15/2027. In preliminary design phases. GDOT will be submitting the concept report on 6/16/25. Although, a LOS is needed to continue work.
- **M006263 FLOYD/SR 20 (US 411) over SR 1 (US 27) Bridge Rehab**
  - Let Date: 7/21/2023. Anticipated Completion: 4/21/2025. 99% complete. *Should* be complete.
- **M006377 FLOYD, SR 1 LOOP FROM SR 20 TO SR1** (resurfacing from US 411 to US 27)
  - Work began 8/11/24 resurfacing SR 1 Loop. Anticipated completion date: 1/31/2025. 95% complete. *Should* be complete.
- **M006202- SR 1;SR 2;SR 3;SR 20 & SR 286 @ 8 LOCS - BRIDGE PRESERVATION**
  - Current Completion Date: 1/31/2026. 11% complete.
  - Project Description: Applying a polymer overlay and replacing joints. The bridge preservation work will take place on eight (8), State Route bridges in Catoosa, Floyd and Whitfield Counties. *Bridge ID 115-0018-0 Floyd County SR 1- US 27 over Oostanaula River.*
